Informed by research and practice with input from academics, clinical experts, consumers and carers, the Health Education and Training Institute (HETI) offers a world class program of study in Psychiatric Medicine, with flexible learning options to prepare you for your College exams and beyond.

The program integrates a recovery-orientation and biopsychosocial understanding of psychiatry with the CanMEDS competencies. This ensures that your practice will be aligned with the latest professional, consumer and carer perspectives on how to most effectively assist people with mental illness to live full and satisfying lives.

All study pathways include:

Formal Education Courses (FEC) and Masters Program

Accredited with the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists (RANZCP) as Formal Education Courses, our Graduate Certificate, Graduate Diploma and Masters courses in psychiatry are designed and delivered in line with College syllabus requirements

for Stage 1 and Stage 2 trainees. RANZCP Students can elect to complete their studies through a postgraduate degree, or non-degree pathway.

Flexible access to study

Students can elect to learn at our campus in North Parramatta, through live web-video conferencing, or delayed online participation – or a combination of these.

Interprofessional Collaboration

Psychiatry trainees, GPs, and Rural and Remote doctors have the opportunity to enhance their ability to work interprofessionally through studying side-by-side with other medical practitioners. Students completing the Masters research units, aligned with RANZCP Scholarly Project development needs, will also study alongside a broader range of health professionals.

New in 2018

To assist students in applying studies to their varying practices, HETI has introduced professional development sessions for year one students. Additional evening web-video forums will be available for GPs and Rural and Remote doctors. RANZCP trainees will participate in a new stream of weekly activities to supplement your education with attention to the special requirements needed for this important work transition. Activities include:

- Preparing for work based assessments and examinations.
- Preparing for and approaching multiple choice questions for success.
- Applying critical appraisal skills to examinations.
- Looking after yourself through the training process.
- Making the most of working with your supervisor and colleague.

Rural and Remote doctors and General Practitioners are welcome to participate in sessions of interest to them.
